Comment

Vitamin B1 (Thiamine) is an essential vitamin required for carbohydrate metabolism. It is converted in the intestine to thiamine pyrophosphate (TPP) which is the active form of Vitamin B1.

Major dietary sources of thiamine are whole grains, lentils, pork, red meat, peas, legumes etc. Thiamine deficiency is usually associated with deficiency of other vitamins as well. The high risk factors for thiamine deficiency include old age, long term parenteral nutrition, hemodialysis, and malabsorption or alcohol abuse. Patients with subclinical and latent thiamine deficiency usually present with non-specific symptoms such as poor sleep, weight loss, malaise, irritability etc. Severe deficiency causes congestive heart failure (wet beriberi), peripheral neuropathy (dry beriberi), Wernicke encephalopathy (a medical emergency that can progress to coma and death), and Korsakoff syndrome (an often irreversible memory loss and dementia that can follow).

Thiamine deficiency is a treatable, yet underdiagnosed disorder. This test can be used to diagnose or screen patients, especially the high risk individuals with Vitamin B1 deficiency and to monitor the efficacy of treatment.
